- 2. How organizational ideologies and practices influence mental health treatment options; and
- 3. The extent to which mental health services delivered by social workers challenge or reinforce neoliberal discourse on mental health.

Dr. Catrina Brown and her research team will begin with an overview of their findings. The team will then lead participants in several breakout discussion groups, as we discuss the implications for social workers in Nova S cotia.
