"The City of Winnipeg's Emergency Management Office (EMO) is presenting Ready Winnipeg – Emergency Preparedness.

Many emergency events disproportionately affect vulnerable groups in our city, including newcomers. They may not be aware of the hazards that Winnipeg faces, or how to prepare for potential disasters or emergencies. The presentation will include information about a variety of different hazards and emergencies Winnipeg and the surrounding community may face, including:

- Dangerous weather conditions, such as extreme cold and heat, tornados, wind storms, snow storms, and heavy rainfall.
- Floods, power outages, train derailments, fires, and building closures.

Attendees will explore simple ways to help newcomers prepare for emergencies. They will also learn strategies to help people stay safe in the moments leading up to, and throughout, an emergency response.

Objectives:

1. To empower settlement staff to help their newcomer clients prepare for emergencies and disasters in Winnipeg by providing tools and resources.
2. To provide a safe space for questions and learning opportunities.
3. To normalize the uncertainty surrounding emergency preparedness, and help attendees feel confident sharing this critical information within their communities.
